FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

The end of Term 1, and beginning of Term 2, has been a very busy calendar of events at the College.

On Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th March our College celebrated its seventh year of involvement in the Cancer Council's 'Relay for Life' community fundraising event. Our Montmorency Secondary College team had 223 active participants and at the end of the weekend had raised \$11,127. Our student leaders were led by Leading Teacher, Michelle Clark, in organising an impressively large and committed team. Michelle, together with student leaders Zoe Liberona, Tom Jeffs, Keenan Shantz, Taleah Scopel and Kyra Krukowitch were responsible for leading this great effort which resulted in our team being awarded a 'Research Award'. A contingent of our senior students stayed overnight to ensure we were represented on the track at all times. A special thank you to staff Bronwyn Mackey, Michelle Clark, Kerryn Murray, Kate Webb and Mayumi Yokoe, who also stayed during the night to supervise team members.

On Wednesday 23rd March we held our sixth successive House Athletics Carnival at Willinda Park. Although threatening to rain, the weather was very kind to us and there was an amazing array of costumes and outfits worn by many students to promote and support their House colours. Again this year, students were highly competitive in most events and a lot of impressive teamwork and individual athletic talent was on display. Congratulations to all staff and students involved and a special thank you to Sports Co-ordinator, Bruce Collins, who put in many hours of work on the day and in preparation to make it so successful. Also, a big thank you to the parents who attended to support the event and congratulations to Darebin House for their magnificent victory.

Following on from our successful Swimming Sports Carnival in Term One, five of our students have had some outstanding achievements, both at State and National Level. In the Victorian State Schools Swimming Championships, Year 12 student, Andrew Rice, won 3 gold medals and set two new SSV records. Tara Kinder of Year 7 won 2 gold medals and a new SSV record. Jamie Kuhn of Year 11 was also well placed in two events. In March we were also represented at the National Age Championships in Adelaide by Jessica Adams (Year 12), Andrew Rice (Year 12), Tara Kinder (Year 7) and James Hone (former student and College Captain 2015). In April the Australian Swimming Championships, which were selection trials for the Olympic games, were also held in Adelaide at which both Jessica Adams and Andrew Rice competed. Impressively Jessica made the semi-final of the Women's 200m Backstroke. Congratulations to Jessica, Andrew, Tara, Jamie and James on these outstanding sporting achievements.

On Tuesday 19th April we held our annual Open Day/Evening to showcase what Montmorency has to offer prospective students and families enrolling at the College. This proved to be a very exciting event as almost twice as many families were in attendance this year to tour and inspect the College. Our students and staff were superb ambassadors and the faculty

displays, and information provided, were highly impressive. The evening tours were conducted by a number of our student leaders who carried out a wonderful role as tour guide leaders. They were true ambassadors and were informative and confident young individuals who displayed true commitment and leadership qualities. The success of our Open Day is also predicated on many hours of planning and commitment from all staff and 'Pride in Achievement' was certainly on display in abundance.

It was most fortunate that we anticipated much greater numbers this year and Assistant Principal, Mark Lohrey, set up a large screen in our Resource Centre to televise proceedings and presentations from the Auditorium. Both the Auditorium and Library were filled to capacity which augers well for Year 7 enrolments in 2017. A special mention, and big thank you, to our four students who made wonderful presentations to the audience and were wonderful role models and ambassadors for the College: Johanna Ryan (Year 7), Louis Savage (Year 7), Jack Penrose (Year 9) and College Captain, Madison Carroll (Year 12).

On Anzac Day our College was very well represented by our students and staff at two separate commemorative services in the local community. A large group of our students, their parents and College staff paid their respects and attended the Dawn Service at the 'Cenotaph' in Eltham. At this ceremony a wreath was presented and laid by our four College Captains, Brittany Fiddes, Melony Jones, Madison Carrol and Tully Scales. Later in the morning, another group from our College participated at the Montmorency RSL Commemorative Service. Impressively Jason West of Year 7 was part of the ceremony representing the Scouts and our four Middle School Captains, Chloe Robinson, Jack Penrose, Ryan Gardner and Callum Dorset presented wreaths on behalf of our College community.

On Friday 29th April our student leaders held another whole school assembly. Highlights included Ilana Altas and Michael Chen speaking about the 'Close the Gap' program with a most impressive presentation. Our very special guests at the Assembly were Russell Hayes and Peter Klaaysen, representing the Rotary Club, and Bruno Moretti, a local resident and past wheelchair basketball Paralympian and the Australian Wheelchair Basketball Coach. They gave a wonderful presentation to the assembly on the 'Wheelchair for Kids' charity program, which is being supported by our Interact Club and teacher, Ian Toohill.

"There are millions of poor disabled children in under-resourced countries, victims of mines, disease or birth defects, whose lives and that of their families can be changed dramatically by providing them with a suitable fitted wheelchair."

Our Interact Club is assisting The Rotary Club in hosting *The Wheelchair Marathon* fundraiser at Willinda Park, Greensborough on 27th May to raise money for the wheelchairs.

Following on from our Whole College Assembly last Friday, our Interact Club leaders (Leni Law-Davis, Madison Carroll, Hayden Marks, Natasha Jones and Emily Cassidy) organised the College 'Shave for a Cure' fundraising event in our Gymnasium at lunchtime. Well done Danielle White (Year 12), Stuart Callinan (Year 12), Tarlee Clark-Ziday (Year 11) and Patrick Reichenbach (Year 8) for shaving their heads for the cause and Natasha Jones (Year 11) also had her long plaits of hair removed. Teacher, Ian Toohill, also had his head shaved and I had the moustache removed. A special thank you to professional hairdresser, Bonnie Essing, from 'Hair Headquarters' in Watsonia, who also donated her time and skills for this worthy cause and congratulations to Interact who raised several thousand dollars for leukaemia research from this event.

As reported in our last Newsletter, our College was chosen by WaterMarc Banyule to be sponsored in the 2016 'Let's Move For a Better World Challenge'. Our total in the 19 days was 1,777,398 moves which put us in first place. Last Friday, Mark Lohrey, and students, Chloe Robinson and Ryan Gardner, attended the presentation ceremony at the Melbourne Convention Centre. On behalf of the College they accepted the prize of equipment and training to the value of \$40,000. This will be a fantastic asset for our Physical Education Program and possibly a new area in our College redevelopment. Last week I was contacted by our local Member of Parliament (State Government), Vicki Ward, who confirmed that the balance of the \$14m redevelopment money (\$12.6m) was in the State Budget announcement. We also had a congratulatory phone call from our Federal Member of Parliament, Jenny Macklin and both parliamentarians were highly positive about the

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announcement and very complimentary about the positive profile the College has achieved over the last few years. This confirms that we should begin the building phase of our facilities refurbishment and redevelopment as early as November this year.

Finally, in relation to staffing, we welcome back Physical Education teacher, Kylie Donis, who has returned to us after family leave. David Risteski, who was replacing Kylie, has taken up a teaching position at Boronia K-12 College and we thank him for his excellent work at Montmorency.

Wheelchairs for Kids Fundraiser

The Interact Club of Eltham, based at Montmorency Secondary College, is hosting a **Wheelchair Marathon** to raise funds for rugged terrain wheelchairs to be sent to Timor Leste to change the lives of children without one.

Teams of four will take turns to wheel each other around the athletics track in wheelchairs, provided by *Wheelchairs for Kids*, to raise funds pledged by sponsors, at an amount per lap.

This is a whole community, event supported by the College and Eltham Rotary Club, and members of the local community are encouraged to register by contacting Ian Toohill at the College on **toohill.ian.g@edumail.vic.gov.au** for sign up and pledge forms, or call into Montmorency Secondary College.

The aim of the activity is to raise at least \$5,000, which will pay for 20 chairs to be shipped to Timor Leste via the Rotary International logistics network, to change the lives of the recipients. The chairs, which are made by retired Rotarian volunteers in Perth, cost only \$200 and are fully adjustable so they can be adapted as the children grow.

Over the past decade, thousands of these wheelchairs have been sent to developing nations around the world, giving children a new life and hope for the future.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Victorian Government has recently introduced an initiative that will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. This initiative is the Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

The CSEF will assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. It is an annual payment which is made directly to the school that the eligible student attends and is tied to that student.

IF YOU HOLD A VALID MEANS-TESTED CONCESSION CARD, OR ARE A TEMPORARY FOSTER PARENT, YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE CSEF.

The amount payable for eligible primary and secondary students is:

- \$125 for Primary school students.
- \$225 for Secondary school students.

Please note that the allowance <u>will not</u> <u>be paid to parents</u>, but will instead be paid <u>directly to the school</u> to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The CSEF payments are for the application year only and cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
