## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,
In 2016 it has been significant for the College to have a new subject operating as part of our VCE offerings for students. For the first time we have a 'Theatre Studies' class undertaking Units 3 and 4 and this trail blazing class has quickly made itself known to our College community. After meticulous preparation, long hours of study and practice and a lot of personal sacrifices along the way by both the students and their teacher, Joshua Cetin, this class delivered three amazing group performances in our auditorium that had audiences enthralled. Our class presented three performances of 'Gulls' written by Robert Hewett and I was lucky enough to attend the Friday evening premiere on the $13^{\text {th }}$ May. The quality of acting, performance, stagecraft and presentation was superb. I have since had an amazing level of positive feedback on all three performances and both students and Joshua are to be thoroughly congratulated.

The VCE study design for Theatre Studies is very rigid in its requirements and requires students to choose two stage crafts. Teacher Joshua Cetin gave a very good explanation of this when he said that
"..I had to make sure that I chose a play which would challenge each student and ensure there was a maximum potential for a range of different stage crafts. A strong component of Outcome One is to make their own interpretations of the play script. With this in mind, I decided to choose a play that the students had not heard of and had no knowledge so that they could put their own spin on the show."

I know that the audiences agree that the students certainly achieved this. Impressively all the ticket profits from the three performances are being donated to the 'Oakleigh Centre', an organisation that works to improve the quality of life of adults with intellectual disabilities and their families.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE <br> CAMPS, SPORTS \& EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Victorian Government has recently introduced an initiative that will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. This initiative is the Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF). The CSEF will assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. It is an annual payment which is made directly to the school that the eligible student attends and is tied to that student.

IF YOU HOLD A VALID MEANS-TESTED CONCESSION CARD, OR ARE A TEMPORARY FOSTER PARENT, YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR THE CSEF.

The amount payable for eligible primary and secondary students is:

- $\quad \$ 125$ for Primary school students.
- $\$ 225$ for Secondary school students.

Please note that the allowance will not be paid to parents, but will instead be paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The CSEF payments are for the application year only and cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.
